## **Action Taken:**


- 1. The feedback collected from students will be used to plan future sessions on advanced topics related to Intellectual Property Rights.

## **Feedback Analysis:**


The students' feedback was gathered at the end of the session, focusing on the relevance of the topic, clarity of the presentation, and suggestions for future topics.
