Report: Webinar on Quad Fellowship by IIE

The webinar, hosted by the Institute of International Education (IIE), provided valuable insights into the Quad Fellowship, a prestigious program that offers opportunities for students in STEM fields across the Quad nations (Australia, India, Japan, and the United States) to advance their academic and professional careers through financial support, mentorship, and cross-cultural exchanges.

Introduction to Quad Fellowship

The session was introduced by Shannon Plath, who explained that the Quad Fellowship aims to empower outstanding graduate students in engineering, mathematics, science, and technology by fostering research and innovation with a focus on creating a positive social impact. The program provides a variety of resources to support these students, including:

Scholarships

Immersive events and inspiring workshops

Mentorship and career development

Cross-cultural exchange programs

Plath also highlighted that the Quad Fellowship is operated in consultation with a non-governmental task force. This task force includes leaders from academic, foreign policy, and private sectors from each of the four Quad countries. Starting in 2024, the fellowship will be administered by IIE, which already manages several global scholarship programs.

Application Process

The application for the Quad Fellowship includes several components designed to evaluate both academic and professional experience:

Personal & Academic Information

3 Essays reflecting the applicant's motivations and aspirations

3 Letters of Recommendation

Standardized Test Scores: TOEFL IBT or IELTS Academic (if applicable)

Key Dates and Timeline

Application Deadline: April 1, 2024 (5 pm ET)

Expert Review & Interviews: May-June 2024

Announcement of Quad Fellows: July 2024

Resume/CV Requirements

Applicants are required to submit a concise resume or CV, limited to 2 pages, that includes:

Professional experience (academic and non-academic)

Extra-curricular activities (volunteer or charity work)

Skills and educational accomplishments

Applicants will be reviewed by both STEM and non-STEM experts, ensuring a comprehensive assessment of their qualifications.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the Quad Fellowship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

Be at least 18 years old at the time of application.

Be a citizen or legal permanent resident of one of the Quad countries (Australia, India, Japan, or the United States) or one of the 10 ASEAN countries (Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, or Vietnam).

Hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent in a STEM field by August 2024.

Demonstrate superior academic achievement at the undergraduate level.

Prospective graduate students must have applied to an eligible STEM graduate program at a U.S.-based university for the 2024-2025 academic year.

Current Master's or PhD students in the U.S. must be enrolled full-time in an eligible STEM graduate program for the entire 2024-2025 academic year.

Clinical healthcare degree programs, such as Doctor of Medicine or Master of Nursing, are ineligible for this fellowship.

Benefits of the Quad Fellowship

The Quad Fellowship offers several key benefits to selected Fellows, including:

A financial stipend of \$40,000 to be used for academic expenses.

Opportunities to network with leading professionals in STEM, government, and societal sectors.

Access to cross-cultural exchange programs aimed at fostering collaboration across Quad nations.


Upon completing the fellowship, participants will join the **Senior Fellows Network**, an alumni group dedicated to advancing research and innovation for social good.


Conclusion
